Halt schoolinterventie

Information for parents

What is it?

A staff member from Halt visits your child's school at scheduled times. During these sessions, the Halt staff member has one-on-one conversations with students. These conversations aim to:

- Help the student understand the (possible) consequences of their behavior,
- Teach the student how to handle situations differently,
- Encourage the student to apologize if appropriate.

Taking part in the Halt schoolinterventie (consultation) does not have any negative consequences for your child. It is not reported to the police and

does not lead to a criminal

record.

Who is it for?

The consultation hour is meant for:

- Students who need some extra support to make safer choices in the future,
- Students who have been in a conflict or argument,
- Students who have been sent out of class or risk being suspended.

Why?

Together with the school, parents, and students, we want to ensure every student feels safe and comfortable at school. That way, they can focus on learning and growing.

Sometimes young people make mistakes. The goal is to help them reflect on their behavior and its impact on themselves and others. This makes students stronger, more aware, and better able to handle challenges.

What does this mean for you as a parent or guardian?

We believe in working together with parents, as you know your child best.

- You are welcome to join the conversation with your child.
- We ask your permission to record your child's information using a consent form.
- After the consultation, all personal information will be deleted.
- We will inform you afterwards about what was discussed with your child.

Personal Data in the Halt schoolinterventie

Why do we need personal data?

Your child is being registered by the school for a Halt schoolinterventie. For this, Halt needs your contact details and information about your child—also known as personal data. This includes your child's name, age, date of birth, place of residence, and phone number. We also need to know the reason for the referral before we can begin. To use this information, we need your consent (for children under the age of 16). You provide this consent by filling out a (digital) form.

By giving consent, you agree that Halt may record information about the guidance provided in a system, including the answers from a questionnaire (screening tool) that includes questions about school, family, and well-being. We ask these questions to better tailor the guidance to your child's situation and needs. You also agree that Halt may provide feedback to the school about the support offered.

All data is handled with care

Only Halt employees involved in the schoolinterventie are allowed to access this information. These employees are bound by confidentiality and may only share the data if you give consent or if the law requires it. There are some exceptions, but in those cases, the Halt staff member will always inform you that data is being shared.

During and after the intervention, we will inform the school about how your child is doing and when the intervention is completed. In cases of school truancy, the Halt staff member may contact the compulsory education officer. Personal information about your child and their home situation is generally not shared. The recorded data will be retained for one year after the completion of the intervention. After this period, the data will be deleted. You may withdraw your consent at any time. In some cases, withdrawing consent may affect the support provided. Halt will inform you about this.

Important to know

- If you have given consent, you can withdraw it at any time.
- If your child is 16 years or older, they may provide consent themselves.
- You may view or amend the data at any time. If you wish to do so, you can submit a privacy request at www.halt.nl.
- If you have a complaint about how Halt handles personal data, you can file it with the Dutch Data Protection Authority via the complaint form at www.autoriteitpersoonsgegevens.nl.
